Seminar attendance and seminar assignments are mandatory for passing the exam. For possible online courses, activation of video camera and microphone is mandatory.
- Attendance required is minimum 75% for seminars. Attendance and absence records will be kept in class. For online courses, video camera and microphone activation is recommended and encouraged.
